

Available to: Years 10, 11 and 12
Length: Full Year (36 weeks)
Accreditation: 60 SACE Credits – Stage 1

The makeup industry is a highly competitive industry and this course allows students to gain practical skills required to work as a professional photographic makeup artist for weddings in a studio or outdoor environment. Students undertake skin care and basic makeup application and develop techniques to update beauty industry knowledge.

This course will introduce students to the glamorous world of Makeup Artistry. It provides an initial grounding for students who wish to embark on a career as a professional Makeup Artist providing a study/career pathway for students.

Aspects to consider:

- **An interview is required before being accepted into this course**
- **Payment of material costs** for a basic brush set and makeup kit and use of makeup and skin care cosmetics during the course program is **payable to INAP on enrolment**
- Students gain SACE units and National Accreditation
- Students must be prepared to complete their study once a week **during school hours** instruction lesson **(9am to 4pm)** conducted off campus in conjunction with the Partnership
- Students will be given **7 classes** away from Media Makeup Academy in which to complete assignments and retail and photographic work experience. Students do not attend the Academy during this time. It is up to the school to advise if students are required to attend their normal school lessons during this time
- This course is designed for students who wish to gain practical skills required to work as a retail cosmetic consultant and photographic makeup artist for school formals
- During the course you will be required to be available for **work experience**, which may include weekend and/or evening work. A minimum of **10 contact hours** in a retail environment is required. Students may produce evidence of Retail experience completed prior to course commencement if 10 hours has already been completed
- Students develop independent learning skills
- The following items are required:- own camera, stationery, colour wheel, hand towel, makeup cape
- Students must attend all sessions or a \$40 per hour charge may apply for make up lessons
- Please ensure you have read the Media Makeup Terms & Conditions prior to enrolment
