INTRODUCTION TO STUDIO RECORDING
(Partial Certificate II in Music)

This course is designed to give students practical skills in modern studio recording procedures in an industry context.

The program will be run as a 12 week structured work placement at Fat Trax recording studio, where students will train as Studio Assistants and participate in a demo recording for a local band.

Information for Students:

You have been engaged by the local recording studio to assist the main engineer to record a band for a CD to promote their work at local music venues.

As the Studio Assistant, you will be responsible for assisting with setting up recording equipment, doing sound checks, monitoring the quality of recorded sound, labelling/logging recordings, and solving routine problems that occur during the recording.

Aspects to consider:

- Students gain 5 SACE credits and National Accreditation
- Genuine interest in developing skills in the Music and Recording Industry
- Students must be prepared to complete their study once a week **after school hours** instruction lesson from **4pm to 7pm** conducted off campus in conjunction with the Partnership schools
- An interest in Studio Recording and music would be desirable
- Students develop independent learning skills
